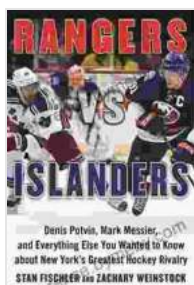


Denis Potvin, Mark Messier, and Everything Else You Wanted to Know About New York

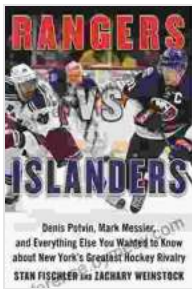

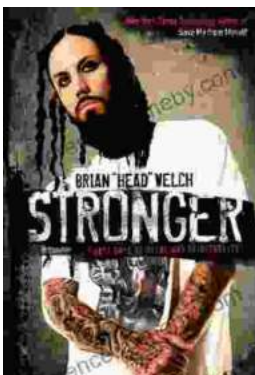
