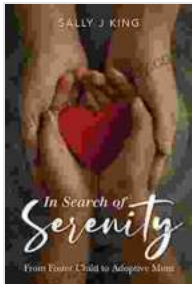

Today, Ethan is a happy and healthy six-year-old boy. He loves to read, play with his friends, and go on adventures with his family.

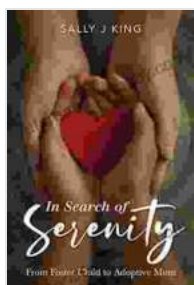
I am so grateful for the journey that has brought me to this point in my life. I never would have imagined that I would become an adoptive mother, but I am so happy that I did.

Adoption is a beautiful thing. It is a way to give a child a loving home, and it is a way to build a family that will last a lifetime.



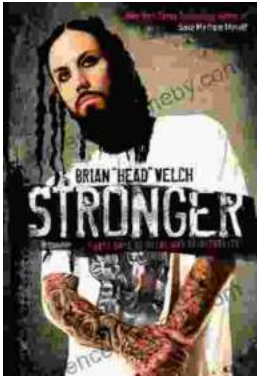

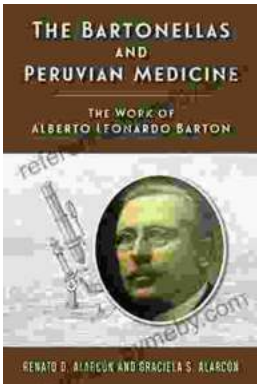
