If you are thinking about raising your kids abroad, I encourage you to do it. It is an experience that will change your life forever.



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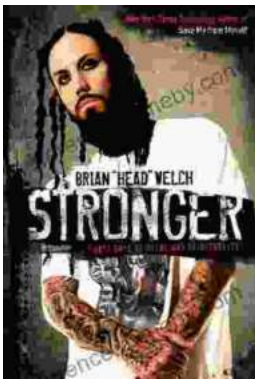
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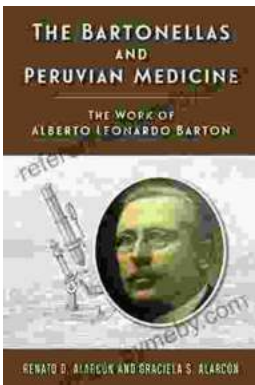
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
